God, we thank you for China, all that you have done through people like Eric Liddell and other people sent there. Through the people who live there and are loving others with the love of Jesus. And thank you for the

Active Prayers for all

- 1. Read the verse from the hymn Take My Life.
- a) How does this hymn apply to the life of Eric Liddell? How might it apply to our lives?
- b) Take my hands, and let them move

at the impulse of thy love;

take my feet, and let them be

swift and beautiful for thee.

Invite people to draw round their hand and their feet. Cut these out. write on them how God might take your hands and use them – what you might DO for God? and on the feet – where you might GO for God. This could be your street, school, or further away...

Read the prayer together again holding your cut out hands and feet.

2. Prayer stations

Sport – Write down some of your gifts and things that you are good at on a Rugby or Football. Thank God for the gifts he has given you and pray that he will help you use them well

Mission – China – write prayers for churches in different countries to grow on a map of China

Living your Faith – On a Star outline – write or draw what you might do to SHINE and live your faith and share God's love

Suffering in time of war – on a newspaper, write short prayers for those suffering from war, or pray for countries where there is war

3. Prayer Circuit!

- a) Teams at different end of the room. On 'Go' one runs to the other and when they meet, they hold hands, thank God for one thing not mentioned by others and 'release' the person they met for their turn to run and give thanks!
- b) Squat and ask (When everyone has had a turn of running) Stand in a circle as a team and when the leader says everyone squats down and as they come back up each person asks God for something for the group, Church, community they are in.
- c) Hands in. At the end of the squat and ask, team put their hands in the middle, on top of each other and all say 'God release your power, amen!' as they throw their hands up and out.

4. Body Praying

Eric Liddell knew that his body was a living sacrifice to God. Using the song head, shoulders, knees and toes we take time to pray for our physical bodies; *Head, shoulders, knees, toes, eyes, ears, chin, mouth, nose.*
